

First public consultation

A series of 3 closed workshops and 3 open webinars were held to discuss the needs of public sector users of open source

First draft of the handbook

After compiling the input received during 2022/2023, the OSOR team drafted a first version of the handbook.





Consultation and v1.0

After a month-long consultation and a workshop, the handbook is being reworked to integrate the feedback received.





Month of consultation

Consultation was held from 30 October to 30 November

Results of the consultation



Main contributors

Public sector representatives, open source advocates, associative and private sector are represented.



Comments and input

As well as numerous text changes, the input covers all chapters as well as the structure of the handbook itself.





Addition

New content, additional information, link to be added...



Clarification

Definition of notions or vocabulary, as well as general meaning of the sentence.

Modification

Iodification

Readability, and clarification of certain grammatical choice as well as structural change to a paragraph.

institutions.








