

2005 Launched as DevMo by Mozilla

A community-driven wiki dedicated to documenting open web standards.

2017 Bringing web docs together!

Achieved a milestone when major tech companies began contributing and supporting web documentation on our platform, solidifying MDN as the central hub for web development knowledge.

2022 MDN Plus

Unveiled a major redesign and introduced MDN Plus, offering personalized features for an enhanced user experience.

- skyclouds2001/mdn-tool A tool focusing on maintaining mdn/data repo, using feature information from content repo, bcd to keep data consistent with latest browser support.
- OnkarRuikar/markdownlint-rule-search-replace A markdownlint plugin built to handle custom linting needs of the MDN content.
- xyy94813/mdn-site Helper scripts for MDN translation tasks, such as initializing an environment, copying specific files, and adding origin commit hashes to translated files in mdn/translated-content.

Where does the community live?

GitHub

We manage all of our repositories on GitHub, including content, platform and any and all examples that exist on MDN. Some parts are private because they're hosting sources for infrastructure, some test environments, internal sandboxes, etc.

Discord



The community of web developers is a big one, but it's getting bigger everyday. MDN has a place for all those web developers, and we are excited to welcome you!


